answer. I do not recall the question.








There were actually only three posters officially issued for the show: the standard version (print run unknown), the woodgrain variant (print run of 75) and the foil variant (print run unknown, but very small). The other variants were never offered to the general public. Rumor has it that the printer experimenting with different inks, generating a handful of copies of Emek then signed and distributed them to friends and associates. I have six of those other variants and believe there may be three to five more.

These are not handbills, but instead full sized versions.



from the larger image.




